You May Need to Know...

Fireworks

Everyone is looking forward to celebrating Independence Day. Please be considerate to neighborhood pets and other beings who may be particularly disturbed by fireworks. Ordinance # 570 only allows igniting, discharging or use of consumer fireworks on the day preceding, the day of, or the day after a national holiday and not at all during the hours from 1 a.m. to 8 a.m. See MI Legal Fireworks on the Township page quick links.

Bulk Trash Pick Up

Bulk trash pick-up starts on July 7. Here are some tips on how to make this process more efficient:

- Know which day of the week you're slated for pick up
- If you think you've been missed, please call the Township, NOT Republic Services customer service.
- Be sure to have it out the night before, they start between 6:00 and 7:00 a.m.
- If possible please try to keep items to 4ft - 8ft max.
- Items must be able to be picked up by 2 people
- No more than 3 bucket loads (loading bucket on the front of the truck)
- NO YARD WASTE, TIRES, PAINT/CHEMICALS, NEEDLES OR HAZARDOUS WASTE - Contact The County Household Hazardous Waste Center www.kalcounty.com/hhw or call 373-5211 for disposal information.

Fire Safety

- While using your gas or charcoal grill, make sure you maintain a safe distance from your home and combustibles. We recommended a minimum of 10 feet clearance.
- Open Burning Requirements:
 - To burn in the open, you are required to obtain a burning permit from your district fire station
 - Open burning is limited to Wednesday through Saturday weather permitting. You are also limited to yard waste only (leaves and brush)

The permits are free. A copy of the burning ordinance may be obtained at your local fire station or our quick links.

Election on Tuesday, August 5

The election involves both proposals and primaries. When voting on the partisan section of the ballot you may only cast votes for one party, you may not “split your ticket” nor can you vote a “straight ticket”. You must vote for the specified number of individuals of one party. Also, please be sure to only mark your ballot within the ovals on the ballot.

Parking Rules

As many residents may have vehicles in need of repair or enjoy RVs, boats, ATVs, and trailers, please keep these ordinance requirements in mind:



- The vehicles may not be located within the public right of way.
- No repairing, redesigning, modifying or dismantling work is allowed on the public right-of-way or other property not zoned for such purposes.
- The vehicles cannot be located within front, side, or rear yard setback areas, which are generally 25 feet (front), five feet (side), and two feet (rear) from the respective property lines. An exception is allowed for periods of cleaning, loading and unloading, provided it does not last more than 48 hours in a seven day period.
- A camper can be used on your property for a maximum of 14 days per year provided running water and bathroom facilities are available within the home for guest use.

Any and all may be located in an enclosed building on your property at any time.

Recycling Impacts

Ever hear about conflicts in distant countries and think, “That’s terrible but there’s nothing I can do about it”. There actually is something you can do. Many of the things we use every day, especially our electronic devices, contain scarce materials from areas of the world that are in conflict, sometimes over those scarce materials. By making sure your used electronic devices are properly recycled and remanufactured you can help reduce the competition for these scarce resources and also prevent health deteriorating pollution. Deplorable Road Conditions

One of Kalamazoo Township residents’ highest priorities is road maintenance and repair, per a fall 2013 survey. Local road contracts for Kalamazoo Township will total \$332,988 in 2014 (over \$167,000 from the township’s general fund and over \$165,000 from the Road Commission Par Funds). In spite of this investment in the local road system, the overall condition of local roads in the Township is declining.

According to the Kalamazoo County Road Commission:

- 43% (31.7miles) are rated as POOR; their reconstruction cost is about \$200,000 per mile,
- 31% (22.9) miles are rated as FAIR; their rehabilitation cost is about \$50,000 per mile,
- Only 26% (19.7) miles are rated as GOOD; these roads do not currently require repair.

The cost to improve the POOR and FAIR roads to GOOD is expensive and requires financial support well beyond the Township’s current resources. The Township Board is considering options to raise additional revenue. We’ll keep you updated on this. There will be a table set up outside the Parks Open House on July 7, 2014 where you can meet with a board member to discuss solutions for the road issue or you may contact Treasurer Cochran at 381-8080. Sidewalks are key features of many roadways because they allow us to safely walk for fitness, reach neighbors, connect to bus lines, and support property values by attracting new residents who increasingly want to live in neighborhoods with sidewalks. Please support the benefits of sidewalks by edging overgrown turf from sidewalks and not planting sidewalk-lifting trees (especially shallow-rooted trees like silver maples) near sidewalks or under power lines (see
